<i>All dairy products manufactured in the People's Republic of China as well as all dairy products manufactured in other countries in which milk originated from China is used.</i>	
<i>Medicines, live animals and birds, pesticides, frozen and chilled fish and meat shipped through Land port of entries in Libya</i>
